Tell us about your style.

My style has certainly evolved over the years. Being the granddaughter and great granddaughter of two legacy Italian women who worked for Gucci, the niece to super model, Cristina Ferrare, and daughter to my mother, Diana, who was a model-turned-full-time-mother, I certainly had a lot of influence regarding couture fashion and making a statement with my unique sense of style. However, this call to elegance wasn't always the case. While attending high school back in the early 90's the coolest place to find the most unique treasures was at the Goodwill or Salvation Army. We were a bunch of Thespian weirdos priding ourselves on discovering vintage duds which, at that time, was authentically our unique expression. As time went on, and I matured as an artistic woman, my sense of style evolved. Whether, I'm color blocking, color coordinating, mixing patterns, monochrome dressing, or finding the perfect silhouette, that's either trending or complementary to my body type, I love a well-made garment. I find myself drawn to the details, the accessories, that little extra flourish finishing the punctuation of an outfit. Nothing feels better than being put together even when I'm just sporting my chucks, a pair of joggers, tank top and a long sleeve denim button up topped with my white puma ball cap. Style can also be super cozy and comfortable. It's just the way you put together the pieces that tell the story. It's an outward reflection of confidence, creativity, uniqueness, and in some ways autonomy. Sovereignty.

Being of Italian decent, my eye is always drawn to the great Italian couture designers, Gucci, Prada, Valentino, Giorgio Armani, Dolce and Gabbana. As I mentioned, my grandmother, Nonna Renata Ferrare and my great-grandmother, Nonny Imperia Torinesi, both worked for Gucci, so I've always felt destined to partner with them, perhaps in the near future.

Of course, I love the elegance and beauty of classic haute couture designers Coco Chanel, Christian Dior, Yves Saint Laurent and Givenchy; the clean lines and chic restraint of Burberry, Louis Vuitton and Ralph Lauren. When I think of my future wedding dress, I imagine Oscar de la Renta. I'm also equally enchanted by Monique Lhuillier, Galia Lahav, Marchesa and Vera Wang...it's just ever since I was a little girl, Oscar captured my heart. I'm a woman who loves a dress and the iconic Halston, and Diane Von Furstenberg wear the crowns; for some creative edge I look to Balmain, Nassau, and 3.1 Philip Lim. For ready-to-wear my go-to's are Karen Millen, All Saints, J-Crew, Banana Republic, Theory, Free People, Alice and Olivia, Michael Kors, Zara, H&M, and Madewell, to name a few. I am a regular shopper at Nordstrom, Macys, Bloomingdales, Neiman Marcus and Saks. For denim, I love classic Levi's for denim jackets along with Seven, Citizens of Humanity and J-Brand. For sporty wear I'm loving Puma, New Balance, Nike,

Lululemon, Beyond Yoga and occasionally Target, in particular their "All in Motion," "Future Collective," and "Universal Thread" fashion lines.

As of late, I've been finding a lot of bold colors, cuts, and fashion statements at Express. In fact, I've worn Express to several of my PR events including the 2022 Game Awards and 2023 MCM Comic Con in London. Their fashion is getting a lot of love from my social media fan base. For the BAFTA's in 2019, I wore a Jovani art deco black dress that fit me like a glove. This year at the BAFTA Games Awards I wore two dresses from Miami-based designer Ema Savahl for the nominee party and red-carpet awards gala. Christian Louboutin is my favorite shoe designer and what I wore on the BAFTA Game Awards red carpet both in 2019 and 2023. So, in summation: I feel Gucci and Louboutin are my couture representation and Express Clothing for accessible every day, ready-to-wear.

Tell us about your time at California State University at Fullerton.

I'm very grateful for my college education and experience. Originally, I had my sights set on east coast legacy theater schools such as Juilliard, NYU, and Carnegie Mellon but alas, I fell in love with a talented singer-songwriter, guitarist from Orange County. Ironically, once I got accepted to California State University at Fullerton, he got accepted to Berkeley College of Music in Boston and ended up moving to the East Coast. Fullerton's musical theater department was ranked one of the strongest on the West Coast. I garnered a tremendous education in theater, music, singing, and dance while attending there. I also made some lifelong friends. I chose a double emphasis in both acting for the camera and musical theater because I didn't want to limit myself to just the stage and dreams of Broadway. I was born and raised in Los Angeles and that's where my support system and Entertainment-centric family resided. Theater will always be my first love and my training ground as an actress, and performer, but I've always been very drawn to the medium of television and film. During my four years at CSUF, I thrived in my classes and played some incredible roles, "Emo" in The Trouble with Nick, "Alice (Childie) McNaught" in The Killing of Sister George, "Victoria (Vicky) Gayforth" in Noël Coward's Tonight at 8:30 - The Shadow Play, "Yelena Andreyevna" in Chekhov's Uncle Vanya, and "Sheila" in the American Tribal Love-Rock Musical, HAIR. When HAIR's original producer, Michael Butler, saw our production, he brought our Potawatomi Tribe to Chicago for a summer production at The New Athenaeum Theater. While in Chi-town we performed "Aquarius" and "Let the Sunshine In" for the Democratic National Convention on the Aire Crown Theatre alongside CSN&Y, Jackson Browne, and Bonnie Raitt and also on the TODAY Show with Bryant

Gumbel. This was quite an exhilarating experience for a bunch of college kids! During my four years, I wanted to study everything that interested me, so I got to co-design hair and makeup on a production of *Nicholas Nickleby*. Some of the more notable teachers that made an indelible impact were, Ron & Lynn Wood, in the voice and movement class who also co-wrote and directed *The Trouble with Nick* for their Kaleidoscope Players, Lara Teeter who taught tap dancing in addition to musical theater classes and he also choreographed *HAIR*. Dan Kern and Gretchen Kanne for acting. Another memorable moment was under the musical direction of Mitch Hanlon when a select group of us performed various musical numbers to commemorate Colin Powell. I approached my four years at university much like I did in high school by applying myself wholeheartedly to anything and everything that interested me in a condensed amount of time. I couldn't wait to get out into the real world and pound the pavement until my dreams became a reality.

Tell us about your part in god of war.

Playing "Freya" in Sony Playstation's top grossing, critically acclaimed, award-winning, best selling video game franchise, *God of War*, has unequivocally changed my life.

In fact, it wasn't until the table read that I knew which video game I was even cast in.

In 2014, my manager got me audition for an "interactive game" where I would be in a MoCap suit, a la *Avatar*, and act out scenes that would later be animated. I could have never imagined the ways in which this "interactive game" would later bestow me two BAFTA nominations for my performance as "Freya-The Witch of the Woods-former Leader of the Vanir-Queen of the Valkyries." I was also completely unaware of the level of artistic sophistication and evolution videogames had undergone. *God of War* is an absolute masterpiece. Sony Santa Monica Studios yields some of the most gifted and innovative video game devs in the world. When I saw the cut scenes from the 2018 game, I was brought to tears several times at the sheer beauty of it all: the lighting, the animation, the landscapes, the gameplay, the sound, Bear McCreary's emotional, masterful score and the most sophisticated writing in the pantheon of video games led by Cory Barlog, Matt Sophos and Richard Gaubert; creating such complex, in-depth characters whose journeys have galvanized a loyal fanbase heralding *God of War* as "The Game of a Generation." Both *God of War 2018* and *God of War Ragnarök* have won countless awards, 10/10 reviews, and set a new record this year with 14 BAFTA Nominations, taking home 6 wins including "Game of the Year." Sony Santa Monica Studios also attracted some of the most gifted, generous actors with such a high caliber of talent. I am in awe every single day knowing that I have been able to create alongside these magnificent artists and human beings for the past nine

years. What a blessing to consider them my family. Freya is a very complex woman. As the preeminent Goddess of Norse mythology, she wears a lot of different hats: the goddess of love, beauty, sex, fertility, war, seidr magic, and gold. Freya wears her heart on her sleeve. She's truthful, sometimes to a fault. At her core, she's a mother, and from this space, she leads. She rules with love and fairness, but her warrior spirit knows when it's time to fight. And when everything is taken from her, including the life of her son Baldur, the only thing she wants is vengeance. At times, I believe her opposing attributes war within her. When you meet Freya in *God of War 2018*, she's been relegated and stuck in Midgard under her ex-husband Odin's binding spell. For 180 years she's been trapped there, stripped of her titles, glory, and purpose. She is now known as the former leader of the Vanir tribe of deities, the once and future Queen of the Valkyries and formerly thriving in the Nine Realms' Vanaheim as the Norse Goddess Freya. So she's a bit of a shell of what she once was, although all of those qualities still reside deep within her. The transformation between the 2018 game and *Ragnarök* left no stone unturned in Freya's journey to redemption. Her great awakening is rife with adversity and hard realities that she must come to terms with. Metaphorically, she goes to Helheim and back to finally possess herself in the end, but this time, on her own terms. This time with true sovereignty.

When did you learn to act?

I was born and raised in Los Angeles, California into a big American Italian family of artists, many of whom made a successful career in the Entertainment Industry. My father, Richard Bisutti, was a child actor in some of the biggest musicals and movies alongside Frank Sinatra, Gwen Verdon, Hayley Mills (*Damn Yankees*, *Pollyanna*, respectively) and my mother, Diana, a model, writer, painter, singer-songwriter, and musician. When I was five years old, we settled outside of the big city into a house on a cul-de-sac, nestled in a small suburb of Ventura County called, Simi Valley. Like most Gen X kids, I would perform self-written skits with the neighborhood kids because we didn't have distractions like smart-phone screens and social media. Our church, Grace Brethren, offered schooling in which I attended from elementary through junior high. Drawn to the arts, I performed in skits, choir, and enjoyed cheerleading. However, because Christian schools are private, there weren't as many opportunities to expand my burgeoning artistic abilities simply because there wasn't ample funding available to support fully produced plays or musicals. So my parents transferred my brother and I to public school at Royal High School, where I experienced plays, musicals, singing in the Madrigal choir, playing basketball, volleyball, leadership, speech and debate. Being raised in an Entertainment-centric family of artists, you could say it's in my blood. All roads paved before me led to my innate desire to

be an actress, filmmaker and singer-songwriter. They didn't lead me down a path where the gates to the Hollywood kingdom were flung wide open, but the road did provide familiarity, support, and curiosity. One of my earliest memories from five-years-old was when I enrolled my family members, after watching *The Wizard of Oz*, to reenact the movie in short form, in our backyard. I was Dorothy, of course, with my stuffed animal Toto and my dad, who played The Wicked Witch of the West, got a bucket of water poured over his head while crying "I'm melting! I'm melting!" From that moment on, I was hooked. My destiny led me exactly on the path of my dreams: acting and creating art in any form, any expression, any capacity, and any level.

What do you do to research your roles?

It's no secret that I am extremely studious when it comes to just about anything that I am passionate about. I am a copious notetaker, and I thrive on deep diving into research like a little Sherlock Holmes. I'm fascinated by history, archaeology, genealogy, and even geology! I just love to get inside the deepest parts of things, the marrow, the magma, the core, the richly nuanced and layered backstory of the story. Now, the magic of embodying a role is best kept a secret.

But I will say, I feel my way into all the characters I play by discovering their wound. Then it's simply telling the truth of that character emotionally within the context of the dramatic narrative.

Aligning a connection from my own life story helps me to empathize deeply with my character and fight for what she needs.

You have an impressive list of roles, which was your favorite?

That is an impossible question to answer. That would be like having a favorite child. I mean even if you did have a favorite kid it would be pretty mean to let the other children know about it. It's difficult for me to answer when asked what my favorite of anything is. The only thing I am certain of is that my favorite food is pasta. I could highlight some of my favorite roles, but each role I've ever played, has taught me something invaluable and has shaped who I am as an actress and human being. I had a lot of fun playing "Barb" in the "Curse of Chucky". It's very freeing to play the bitch everyone loves to hate. I enjoyed the challenge of playing "Michelle Crane, AKA The Mother of Death" in *Insidious Chapter 2* under the tutelage and direction of auteur, James Wan. I loved bridging the gap inside Michelle Crane, 's backstory forcing me to understand her pain and justify why she was cross-dressing her little boy and slapping everyone with such disdain while screaming "Don't you dare!" I was also intrigued by the phrase she kept uttering, "Be a good little girl." But as I have matured throughout the years, I must say the last three roles I've played have given me the most pleasure

thus far. I have felt the freest playing "Witch Hexela" in BYUtv's adventure single-camera comedy *Dwight In Shining Armor* distributed by Paramount. Through Hexela, I got to channel my best Madeline Kahn. Madeline was the comedic heroine in my childhood, inventing such a unique, off-kilter comedic style in iconic comedies such as *Blazing Saddles*, *Clue*, *History of the World, Part 1* and most notably *Young Frankenstein*. The most enigmatic character I've ever played is "Norma Steele" from the upcoming psychological-thriller, fantasy, horror, indie drama called *The Blue Rose*. Norma is a complicated woman, whose past was left nebulous, enabling me to color in all the details that resonated as I studied who she was on the page. I thrive inside this creative collaborative engaging who I feel this woman to be and why she does the things that she does, even if they may be heinous, questionable, selfish, and hurtful not only to others, but to herself. And of course, the role of a lifetime would be attributed to "Freya" in the *God of War* franchise, whose journey has mirrored mine in the most remarkable, synchronistic way. The serendipity of booking that role when I did can only be explain by God's magic. Living through her journey was the therapy I needed. She will always reside within me, the two of us have become synonymous.

What is your favorite food?

Pasta. Always and forever, pasta.

Do you have any pets?

I do not have any pets currently, but I am longing to have a cat. I am definitely a human feline and cats know it. When I meet a fellow feline, there's a bond that runs very deep. I grew up with cats and dogs, but always gravitated more toward the feline species. You could say I'm a cat whisperer of sorts. When I finally do get a cat, it will be one of three (if not all three) a Blue Point Rag Doll, a Maine Coon, and a Bengal. (It's no coincidence that Freya has two large house cats pulling her chariot.) I like dogs. I'm not obsessed with dogs, but the right kind of dog can really do it for me. In particular, I met a Shiba Inu who imprinted on me, and I let that damn dog lick my face. That is unheard of if you know me. I don't like a lot of mess and I'm very scent and sound sensitive so you can imagine dogs are not really my jam and when I meet them, they know it. The problem with dogs is when they know you don't like them, they jump on you, they follow you, they sniff your nether regions, they do everything to get your attention and try to turn you. It's a little desperate if you ask me, but every now and again the dog gets through and all of a sudden there I am petting that darn little thing and loving every second of it. I also am very fond of horses and feel a deep connection to them. I intend on having horses one day at my farmhouse. I'm not sure if I'll become a horse whisperer but I'm certainly open to it.

Tell us about your favorite shoes!

My favorite shoes are Christian Louboutin. There is no comparison. The red detail on the sole is the most elegant, sexy, feminine, empowered, unique detail of any shoe ever created. They embody the essence of a woman. They are absolute perfection. For comfort, I really like a good classic pair of Chuck Taylors and Havaiana flip-flops. Oh, I'm a shoe lover, so the list of other shoes I love is long...

Tell us about your daily life.

I am a busy woman.

I don't recall a time I've ever woken up and asked myself "I wonder what I'll do today?" As a Libra, finding balance in my daily life is vital. Most of my time is spent either creating something or putting the pieces together for a creative project.

When I'm not creating, I am living life to the fullest.

I aim to get 8-9 hours of sleep every night, to recharge my battery. If I don't get that full cycle, I will take a nap. I operate on so many high functioning cylinders every single day with numerous creative projects, partners and a circle of family and friends that if I don't get my rest, I am hurting the next day.

I absolutely adore and cherish my self-care rituals and routines that keep me balanced, joyful, youthful, and operating in optimal health. Ever since I stood their enamored, watching the nightly skincare routine of both of my luminous grandmothers, I have maintained a thorough skincare regimen every night (and morning) with the most high-end skincare products that nourish, hydrate, and restore my skin. This nightly routine takes about 15 minutes and I relish every second of it. Physically, right now it's about building and maintaining my strength, endurance, agility, and flexibility in my body. I achieve this through lifting weights, any form of dance, ballet barre, pilates, and yoga. I enjoy cardio in the form of a low-impact spin class, walks in nature, hikes, and riding a bike.

I enjoy cooking and entertaining family and friends. As an Italian, feeding people is saying "I love you." The result is a lean, healthy, energized body functioning at its optimal capacity. It feels good to elevate my heart rate, break a nice sweat, and get my circulation going.

My tenants of balanced good health are: Sleep. Exercise. Meditation. Prayer. Self-Care. Pause. Rest. Nature. Gratitude journaling. Massage. Energy work. Breath work. Aromatherapy. Mental therapy. Somatic therapy. Mindfulness. Becoming present to my

Ever since God of War Ragnarök dropped in November 2022, it has been a nonstop roller coaster and one that I'm very grateful for. Now that we're in July, things are starting to slow down. I'm taking a much needed break, enjoying vacations and starting to unwind. This downtime has been vital for my mental, emotional, and physical health. And then sometimes there's too much quiet time when auditions are slow or, as we are facing right now, a writer's strike and pending SAG-AFTRA strike. Luckily, the phone not ringing has never stopped me from being creative. I started creating my own content a long time ago and I've been writing songs and music since high school. Now, I actively produce projects with my company, Perfect Timing Productions. I've always been actively curious about the world around me and looking for ways to reflect that in my art.

Do you work with any charities?

Yes, I do. There are a handful of charities that I have been blessed to support throughout the years: Go Campaign, Mary's Meals, Chrysalis, Hollywood Food-Co, and PATH. I also enjoy tithing at my church, Bel Air Presbyterian, which is heavily involved in several charities throughout Los Angeles and the world.
